Note to teachers and students on the use of published marking schemes

Marking schemes published by the State Examinations Commission are not intended to be standalone documents. They are an essential resource for examiners who receive training in the correct interpretation and application of the scheme. This training involves, among other things, marking samples of student work and discussing the marks awarded, so as to clarify the correct application of the scheme. The work of examiners is subsequently monitored by Advising Examiners to ensure consistent and accurate application of the marking scheme. This process is overseen by the Chief Examiner, usually assisted by a Chief Advising Examiner. The Chief Examiner is the final authority regarding whether or not the marking scheme has been correctly applied to any piece of candidate work.

Marking schemes are working documents. While a draft marking scheme is prepared in advance of the examination, the scheme is not finalised until examiners have applied it to candidates' work and the feedback from all examiners has been collated and considered in light of the full range of responses of candidates, the overall level of difficulty of the examination and the need to maintain consistency in standards from year to year. This published document contains the finalised scheme, as it was applied to all candidates' work.

In the case of marking schemes that include model solutions or answers, it should be noted that these are not intended to be exhaustive. Variations and alternatives may also be acceptable. Examiners must consider all answers on their merits, and will have consulted with their Advising Examiners when in doubt.

Future Marking Schemes

Assumptions about future marking schemes on the basis of past schemes should be avoided. While the underlying assessment principles remain the same, the details of the marking of a particular type of question may change in the context of the contribution of that question to the overall examination in a given year. The Chief Examiner in any given year has the responsibility to determine how best to ensure the fair and accurate assessment of candidates' work and to ensure consistency in the standard of the assessment from year to year. Accordingly, aspects of the structure, detail and application of the marking scheme for a particular examination are subject to change from one year to the next without notice.

A forward slash / before an answer indicates that the answer is synonymous with that which preceded it or is an alternative answer. Answers separated by a forward slash cannot therefore be taken as different answers.

A dash - before an answer indicates that the answer is a separate answer, which may be considered as independent of any other suggested answers to the question.

Rounded brackets () indicate material which is not considered to be essential in order to gain full marks.

Square brackets [] show a breakdown of marks within the question or give further clarifications for marks to be awarded for certain answers to that question.

Underlined information is essential in order to gain marks.

N. B. In all Sections of the examination the answers given on the marking scheme should not be considered as the only possible answers that may be accepted. Answers which are synonymous with or equivalent to those on the published marking scheme are also acceptable.

In developing the marking scheme the following should be noted:

- *In many cases only key phrases are given which contain information and ideas that must appear in the candidate's answer in order to merit the assigned marks*
- *The descriptions, methods and definitions in the scheme are not exhaustive and alternative valid answers are acceptable*
- *The detail required in any answer is determined by the context and the manner in which the question is asked, and by the number of marks assigned to the answer in the examination paper. Requirements and mark allocations may, therefore, vary from year to year.*
- *Words, expressions or phrases must be correctly used in context and not contradicted, and where there is evidence of incorrect use or contradiction, the marks may not be awarded.*

SECTION C (25 MARKS)

Candidates are required to answer any ONE item from either Q1 (a) or 1 (b) or Q2 (a) or 2 (b).

Guidelines for Section C

- Should a candidate answer more than one item from Question 1 **or** Question 2, **all** items must be marked and marks awarded **only** for the **ONE** item with the higher scoring.
- Minor inaccuracies (i.e. which do not distort ‘message’) should be ignored.
- Verbs must be correct for full marks.

Note: In any part of written production the same mistakes will not be penalised twice.

Question 1. When marking this question the priorities indicated for Content and Language in Section B, Q.5. should be broadly adhered to.

Question 1 (a) DIALOGUE CONSTRUCTION (25 marks)

Six ‘turns’. **FIVE** to be answered. If all ‘turns’ are answered, mark **all** and award marks for the highest scoring **FIVE**. Allow a maximum of **5** marks each. **(5 x 5m = 25 marks)**

OR

Question 1 (b) LETTER / EMAIL (25 marks)

- There are **FIVE** points to be made from a possible **eight**. Allow a maximum of **5** marks each. If more than five points are answered, mark **all** and award marks for the highest scoring **FIVE**.
- Note that each point should be *developed* and *expanded*.
- Letter/email can be **loosely** based on the suggestions given.
- Candidates can make their own points and need not use the guidelines given.
- Correct register for letter/email is expected. **(5 x 5m = 25 marks)**

2 marks: Some communicative intention fulfilled.
Quite a few grammatical errors and spelling mistakes.
Incorrect verb usage/ tenses wrong.

APPENDIX ONE

REASONABLE ACCOMODATIONS & MODIFIED MARKING SCHEME

A modified marking scheme is applied to the work submitted by candidates who have been granted one or a combination of the following arrangements:

- *Use of a tape recorder on grounds of a learning difficulty*
- *Use of a tape recorder on grounds of a physical difficulty*
- *Use of a voice activated word processor*
- *Use of a scribe*
- *Waiver in relation to spelling and grammar*
- *Use of a word processor on grounds of a learning difficulty only (computer with the spell check and grammar check facility enabled/ turned on).*

For those candidates who are granted a spelling and grammar waiver, errors in certain grammatical areas are not penalised. In assessing the work of these candidates, a modified marking scheme will apply.

Aural

As this part of the examination is answered in English there is no special consideration given, as incorrect spelling and grammar are not penalised in the standard marking scheme.

Sections A and B

For questions that are answered in Spanish, incorrect spelling and certain elements of grammar such as verb endings and agreement of adjectives will not be penalised.

Section B Question 5

Content and communication will be marked as standard, but incorrect spelling, such as missing or incorrect accents, and elements of grammar, such as verb endings and agreement of adjectives will not be penalised.

Section C

Content and communication will be marked as standard, but incorrect spelling, such as missing or incorrect accents, and elements of grammar, such as verb endings and agreement of adjectives will not be penalised.

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
